

Expo 2005 Museum



The 2005 World Exposition, Aichi, Japan (official abbreviation and nickname: EXPO 2005 AICHI, JAPAN) was held under the theme, Nature's Wisdom. The Expo strived to provide solutions to the global problems confronting the human race and a new direction for humanity. Participants from one hundred twenty-one countries, four international organizations, NGOs/NPOs, and all walks of life assembled at the first world exposition of the twenty-first century. The Expo successfully ended on September 25, 2005 after receiving high praise from within Japan and from abroad.

This building was used as the Guest House and Reception Hall during the Expo. Now, reestablished as the Expo 2005 Museum, the facility will serve not only to commemorate the Expo, but also to reawaken enthusiasm and pass down the philosophy and achievements of the event to future generations.

It is our hope that this museum will help keep memories of the Expo alive in visitors' hearts and convey and build on the messages of the Expo.





VIP Room
